LIFE EVERLASTING

Eternal life begins with Baptism. It continues through death and will have no end. The so-called particular or personal judgement occurs at the moment of death of an individual. The general judgement, which is also called the Last Judgement, occurs on the Last Day, at the end of the world, when the Lord comes again.

Heaven is the endless moment of love. Nothing more separates us from God, whom our soul loves and has sought our whole life. Together with all the angels and saints we will be able to rejoice forever in and with God.

Purgatory, often imagined as a place, is actually a condition. Someone who dies in God's grace (and therefore at peace with God and others) but who still needs purification before they can see God



face to face is in purgatory. Since all those who are baptised into Christ form one communion and are united with one another, the living can also help the souls of the faithful departed in purgatory. Our love extends into the next life, through our prayer, fasting and good works we can obtain graces for the departed.

Hell is the condition of everlasting separation from God, the absolute absence of love. Someone who consciously and with full consent dies in serious sin, without repenting, and refuses God's merciful, forgiving love forever, excludes themselves from communion with God and the saints. God does not damn human beings. Humans themselves are the ones who refuse God's merciful love and voluntarily deprives themself of eternal life by excluding themselves from communion with God. God yearns for communion even with the worst sinner; he wants everyone to convert and be saved. Yet God created man to be free and respects our decisions. Even God cannot compel love.

The Last Judgement will take place at the end of the world, at the second coming of Christ. "All who are in their tombs will hear his voice and come forth, those who have done good, to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil, to judgement" (John 5:29).

We read in St Matthew's Gospel:

"When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on his glorious throne. Before him will be gathered all the nations of the earth, and he will separate them one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, and he will place the sheep at his right hand, but the goats at the left... And they will go away to eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life".

At the end of time, God will create a new heaven and a new earth. Evil will no longer have any power or attractiveness. The redeemed will stand face to face with God - as his friends. Their yearning for peace and justice will be fulfilled. To behold God will be their blessedness. The Trinity will dwell among them and wipe away every tear from their eyes; there will be no more sorrow, death, lamentation, or trouble. God will be all in all, and we pray and hope that we will be worthy of such a great gift, life eternal with God and all the angels and saints.

FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

17th November - Memoria of St Elizabeth of Hungary - St Elizabeth was born in 1007, the daughter of Andreas II of Hungary, was betrothed aged four, married Louis IV of Thuringia when aged fourteen, bore three children, widowed when twenty (her husband dying while on a crusade). Accused of wasting the state's wealth by her charity to the poor, she was deprived of the regency and exiled. She lived in a convent for a time, then retired to a cottage. Throughout her life, she was noted for her constant prayer and generous almsgiving. She died in 1031. She is the patron saint of hospitals, nurses and bakers.

18th November - Memoria of the Dedication of the Basilicas of St Peter & St Paul - The Basilicas of St Peter & St Paul are two of the four major basilicas of Rome (the others being St John Lateran and St Mary Major). The original church of St Peter was built in 323 by the Emperor Constantine over the apostle's tomb (the tomb was rediscovered by excavations in the crypt from 1942); the present basilica was dedicated by Pope Urban VIII in 1626. The first church of St Paul was built over his grace in 324, enlarged in 395, burnt down in 1823 and replaced by the present building, dedicated in 1854.

21st November - Memoria of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary - This feast has been celebrated in the Eastern Church since the sixth century and in the West since the fifteenth.

22nd November - Memoria of St Cecilia - St Cecilia is venerated as a virgin and martyr of Rome. In the second/third century she refused to worship the pagan gods and was beheaded. In the Trastevere church of St Cecilia in Rome, there is a recumbent sculpture of the martyr with three fingers extended, still proclaiming the Christian doctrine of the Holy Trinity (Father, Son and Spirit); this image reproduces how her body was found when her tomb was opened in 1599. She is the patron saint of music and musicians.
