We are very blessed in our parish to have so many parishioners who have come from, or have family origins in, many countries throughout the world. We give thanks for the great gift of the universality of our Catholic Faith, but also the diverse cultures which make up our parish.

To celebrate the great diversity of cultures we have in our parish we will hold a **Parish International Night on Friday 8th September beginning with Mass at 6.30pm** followed by an evening in the Parish Hall which will include food from various countries. This event proved to be such a success last year and we hope it will be a huge success this year too. It would be great to have a good number of parishioners coming along, and also to have food dishes from as many countries as possible which are represented here in the parish.

Fr Wyllie asks that parishioners who originate from other countries, especially those who made meals last year, get in touch with him (either by email or speaking to him after Mass) and let him know if you would be able to cook a dish to be enjoyed at the International Night. It can be a simple starter, main course or dessert. Last year we had food from Fiji, Czech Republic, Germany, Australia, South Africa, Ireland, England, Poland, Scotland, Italy and a number of other countries. If you come from another country or know a dish from your country of family origin then please prepare something for this event. There of course can be more than one dish for each country. **Let Fr Wyllie know if you are bringing a dish with you, by Thursday 31st August**.

On the night after the meal, there will be a simple quiz as well as a raffle. The Bar will also be open to purchase refreshments. Donations of raffle prizes would be very gratefully received. Please place them at the back of the church by Thursday 7th September.

The Parish Hall will be set up for the event on the Thursday evening (7th September) at 6.30pm, so if you could lend a hand to decorate and move furniture it would be really appreciated. If anyone has a flag of their home country or the country of their family origin, then please bring it along on 7th September so that the Hall can be set up that evening.

These social events are a prefect opportunity for us to invite friends, family and neighbours who have maybe lapsed from their practice of their faith, or to those who live in our communities who are of another faith or no faith at all. So please, consider inviting them, but please include them on the sign up sheet, so we know numbers in order for us to prepare and set up accordingly. Friday 8th September is also the Feast of the Birthday of Our Lady, so it's a very fitting day for us to come together as one parish family, made up of people from various cultures and countries.

# FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

**28th August - Memoria of St Augustine -** St Augustine was born in 354 to Patricius and Monica in North Africa (present day Algeria). Extremely intelligent, he crossed to Europe as a young man and, after a short time in Rome, went to Milan. He had a brilliant career there but, still unbaptised, also lived a rather dissolute life. Encouraged by his mother, he received baptism and returned, a committed Catholic, to North Africa. He was made the bishop of Hippo, an outstanding preacher, writer and churchman. He is a doctor of the Church and died in 430. Her is the patron saint of brewers, printers and theologians.

**29th August - Memoria of the Passion of St John the Baptist -** St John the Baptist, cousin of the Lord, was imprisoned and decapitated by Herod Antipas, son of Herod the Great, for his heroic witness to the truth, thereby becoming the precursor of the Lord's own violent death, as he had been in his remarkable birth and prophetic teaching. He is patron saint of builders, tailors, conversion to faith and people who need healing from spasms or seizures.

# SECOND COLLECTION FOR ECCLESIASTICAL STUDENTS

Throughout the diocese a second collection will be taken up on Saturday/Sunday 9th/10th September to help cover the costs of training our future priests. At present is costs  $\pounds 25,000.00$  a year to train one seminarian each year, so please give whatever you can to this cause.
