

FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

3rd September - Memoria of St Gregory the Great - St Gregory the Great was born in 540 of a noble Roman family, he had been the Prefect of the city and then became a monk. He was sent as a papal ambassador to Constantinople for three years. In 590 he was called to be bishop of Rome and pope. His work rightly earned him the sobriquet 'Great'. He was an excellent administrator and organiser in areas of doctrine and liturgy, as well as disciplinary matters. He is known in England as the pope who sent Augustine to Canterbury. Pope Gregory was a preacher, an author, a homilist, and exegete, a theologian, a correspondent and a diplomat. He is recognised as a Father of the Church, a truly great man. He died in 604 and is the patron saint of musicians, singers, students and teachers.

5th September - Memoria of St Teresa of Calcutta - St Teresa of Calcutta was born Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu in Skopje, Albania in 1910, her father died when she was nine years old. Called to be a missionary, Agnes entered the Sisters of Loreto in Ireland, and departed for Calcutta in 1929. She taught for a number of years, and, as a result of mystical experiences, Teresa felt called by Christ to establish a religious community, Missionaries of Charity, dedicated to the service of the poorest of the poor. Teresa and her sisters reached out to the poor with love on the streets of Calcutta wearing the distinctive, blue-trimmed white sari. The Missionaries of Charity are active in every continent. Mother Teresa was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1979. She died in 1997 and was canonised in 2016. She is the patron saint of World Youth Days and the Missionaries of Charity.
