SEA SUNDAY

Every year churches around the world celebrate Sea Sunday. It is a day for people to come together to pray for seafarers and fishers, and thank them for the vital role they play in all of our lives.

Crews can spend months away working long hours with little respite or contact with home. On top of the daily pressures, the threat of piracy, shipwreck and abandonment are ever present for the men and women who serve us at sea.



In recent years, this challenging job has become even harder. Increased STELLA MARIS restrictions and lockdowns (due to the global covid-19 pandemic) saw many seafarers working beyond the end of their contract, facing months of uncertainty and further separation from loved ones. That's months of missed birthdays, anniversaries, funerals, and family celebrations.

Amid these challenges, the Apostleship of the Sea and other organisations have been a constant source of practical support and reassurance. Through their teams worldwide, they've been supporting the 1.5 million unseen keyworkers who have helped to keep the economy afloat and transport the essentials we need to survive.

The port centres have always been a haven for mentally and physically exhausted seafarers. For those who can't make it into the centres, our chaplains and ship visitors take a warm welcome and listening ear onboard. And when that's not been possible, email, social media, and WhatsApp have been a lifeline of support.

If a seafarer wants to get to the shops, they need the right documentation, permission for shore leave, transportation, and enough time to get there and back – none of which is easy.

This is where Apostleship of the Sea and other organisations come in. When seafarers can't get to us, we go to them. Over the years, especially the past few years when there was no shore leave, our team became masters of logistics, working against the clock to get shopping to crews before they moved on.

We bought everything from fresh fruit and medication to musical instruments and computers. These items helped to preserve the dignity of our seafarers, bringing joy to their families, and reminded them that we care.

On this Sea Sunday, please remember the contribution that seafarers make to our daily lives, and the Apostleship of the Sea that supports them.

A Prayer for Sea Sunday:

Heavenly Father, we give thanks to you for your creation and all the beauty in this world. We thank you for the ocean, in its abundance, and for the people who toil on its surface. Without our brothers and sisters who are seafarers, we would not be able to enjoy all the blessings of this world. Enfold them in your fatherly love, guide their passage through storm, swell and darkness. May we always be mindful of our Global Family and be truly grateful for the sacrifices seafarers make each day. Amen

FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

9th July - Feast of Our Lady of Aberdeen - As this Feast falls on a Sunday, it is only celebrated in Aberdeen City itself, as the Sunday takes precedence. Devotion to Our Lady of Aberdeen stems back at least to Bishop Gavin Dunbar (1514-1531) when a statue of the Madonna and child was placed by him in a chapel near the Bridge of Dee. It was saved from destruction during the Reformation, and eventually found its way to Brussels. It continues to be venereated there under the title of Notre Dame du Bon Succes (Our Lady of Good Success). A number of copies are the object of devotion here in Scotland. In our own diocese, the statue on the sanctuary of Motherwell Cathedral is that of Our Lady of Good Success, under the title Our Lady of Good Aid.

11th July - Feast of St Benedict - St Benedict was born at Norcia, north-east Rome in 480, where he went to study law. He was appalled by the immorality of the city, and abandoned it, going to Subiaco, east of Rome, where he became a religious hermit. Gradually others were attracted to join him and communities were set up which he directed. Local jealousies made it unwise for him to stay so he set up anew at Monte Cassino, south of Rome. His influence was widespread: many came from Rome to consult him, and many monasteries were founded elsewhere, so that his way of life and thinking had a huge civilising effect on Europe, which made Pope Paul VI name him Patron of Europe in 1964. He died in 547. He is also the patron of students.

15th July - Memoria of St Bonaventure - St Bonaventure was baptised John in 1221. St Francis of Assisi was credited with curing him from a serious illness while still a child, and so his mother nicknamed him "Buona Ventura" (Good fortune). He joined the Franciscans and, aged 35, was elected Minister General or superior of the Franciscans. He provided them with a good structure for running their affairs and a clear spirituality based on the sayings of St Francis. He wrote many works on philosophy and theology, intertwining the two. Among theologians he is called the Seraphic Doctor. He died in 1274 and is honoured as the patron of bowel disorders.



Day Seven Visit to San Damiano with Mass, Leisurely afternoon
