FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

22nd August - Memoria of the Beheading of St John the Baptist - St John the Baptist was imprisoned and decapitated by Herod Antipas, son of Herod the Great, for his heroic witness to the truth, thereby becoming the precursor of the Lord's own violent death, as he had been in his remarkable birth and prophetic preaching. He is the patron of builders, tailors, printers, baptism, converts, people dealing with storms, and people who need healing from spasms or seizures.

3rd September - Memoria of St Gregory the Great - St Gregory the Great was born in 540 of a noble Roman family, he had been Prefect of the city and then became a monk. He was sent as a papal ambassador to Constantinople for three years. In 590 he was called to be the bishop of Rome and pope. His work rightly earned him the sobriquet 'Great'. He was an excellent administrator and organiser in areas of doctrine and liturgy, as well as in disciplinary matters. He was known in England as the pope who sent Augustine to Canterbury. Pope Gregory was a preacher, an author, a homilist, and exegete, a theologian, a correspondent. He is rightly recognised as a Father of the Church. He is patron of musicians, singers, students, and teachers.

SECOND COLLECTION IN SEPTEMBER

A Second Collection will be taken up next weekend, 3rd/4th September, to help train our future priests. At present, the diocese has to pay in the region of £25,000 for each seminarian per academic year. PROJECT GAMBIA

Working with a range of partners both in the UK and in The Gambia, Project Gambia has, since 2007, established a range of projects in schools, villages, and farms to provide education, support, and funding to enable people to find a sustainable solution to poverty. Project Gambia have asked to come and give us an update on the work they have been doing since their last visit before Covid. **After Mass on 10th/11th September there will be a bucket collection outside the church for us to contribute to the work they are doing in The Gambia.**

DIOCESAN VOCATIONS MASS

On Tuesday of this week, 30th August, Bishop Toal will celebrate Mass together with the priests and seminarians of the Diocese at 7.00pm in Our Lady of Good Aid Cathedral, Motherwell. The Bishop encourages all those in the diocese to come together to pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood, the diaconate and the consecrated life.

PARISH WEEKLY SCHEDULE

As the summer holidays are now over, our normal weekly parish schedule has resumed. Fr Wyllie would like to extend an invitation and an encouragement to all parishioners to support all that happens each week in our parish. Here are a few things he would like to encourage you to come along to:

The Wednesday Evening Mass

This was introduced to enable those who work during the day to attend Mass at least once a week. Although this Mass is quite well attended, there are very few parishioners attending who couldn't attend the morning Mass. So please, if you work during the day, try to make an effort to come along to Mass on a Wednesday evening.

The Monday 12noon Mass

Although this Mass was introduced because Fr Wyllie spent Monday mornings in the High School, it is a good opportunity for people who aren't great in the mornings to manage along to Mass during the week. Please try to come along to the 12noon Mass on a Monday.

The Morning Masses

Great emphasis has been placed on receiving Holy Communion as often as possible, but sadly, we have a dwindling number of parishioners attending weekday Mass, especially in Our Lady & St John's (some mornings we only have 5 or 6). If you are retired, part-time, on holiday or unemployed, please try to come along to Mass in the mornings to sanctify your day and to come before the altar to hear God's word and receive him sacramentally.

Confessions

We do well here in the parish with people coming to Confession. There are various opportunities each week for Confession so please avail yourself of this Sacrament of God's love and mercy. Each week confessions are heard in St Mary's on a Saturday evening from 4.45pm until 5.15pm and a Wednesday morning from 9.30am until 9.50am; Our Lady & St John's on a Wednesday evening from 6.30pm until 6.50pm and a Thursday morning from 9.00am until 9.30am.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament
