## THE WORD OF THE LORD

**26TH JANUARY 2025** 

It pleased God, in his goodness and wisdom, to reveal himself and to make known the mystery of his will (Ephesians 1:9). His will was that all people should have access to the Father, through Christ, the Word made flesh, in the Holy Spirit, and thus become sharers in the divine nature. By this revelation, then, the invisible God, from the fullness of his love, addresses us as his friends and moves among us, in order to invite and receive us into his own company. This economy of Revelation is realised by deeds and words, which are intrinsically bound up with each other. As a result, the works performed by God in the history of salvation shows forth and bear out the doctrine and realities signified by the words; the words for their part, proclaim the works, and bring to light the mystery they



contain. The most intimate truth which this revelation gives us about God and the salvation of man shines forth in Christ, who is himself both the mediator and the sum total of Revelation.

God, who creates and conserves all things by his Word, provides us with constant evidence of himself in created realities. And, furthermore, wishing to open up the way to heavenly salvation, he manifested himself to our first parents from the very beginning. After the fall, he buoyed them up with the hope of salvation, by promising redemption; and he has never ceased to take care of the human race. For he wishes to give eternal life to all those who seek salvation. In his own time God called Abraham, and made him into a great nation. After the era of the patriarchs, he taught this nation, by Moses and the prophets, to recognise him as the only living and true God, as a provident Father and just judge. He taught them, too, to look for the promised Saviour. And so, throughout the ages, he prepared the way for the Gospel.

The divinely revealed realities, which are contained and presented in the text of Sacred Scripture, have been written down under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. For Holy Mother Church relying on the faith of the apostolic age, accepts as sacred and canonical the books of the Old and New Testaments, whole and entire, with all their parts, on the grounds that, written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, they have God as their author, and have been handed on as such to the Church herself. To compose the sacred books, God chose certain men who, all the while he employed them in this task, made full use of their powers and faculties so that, though he acted in them and by them, it was as true authors that they consigned to writing whatever he wanted written, and no more.

Since, therefore, all that the inspired authors, or sacred writers, affirm should be regarded as affirmed by the Holy Spirit, we must acknowledge that the books of Scripture, firmly, faithfully and without error, teach that truth which God, for the sake of our salvation, wished to see confided to the sacred Scriptures. Thus "all Scripture is inspired by God, and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction and for training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work" (2 Timothy 3:16-17).

## FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

**28th January - Memoria of St Thomas Aquinas** - St Thomas Aquinas was born in 1225 and abandoned his aristocratic upbringing to join the Dominican Order. He was a man of prayer which bore fruit in extensive writings on spiritual subjects, for which he has the additional title of Doctor of the Church. His theological works, especially his Summa Theologica, were the standard texts for students of the priesthood for centuries afterwards, and even today. He died in 1274 and is honoured as the patron saint of students, teachers, Catholic universities, and publishers.

**31st January - Memoria of St John Bosco** - St John Bosco was born in 1815 and dedicated his life as a priest to the street children of Turin, finding them shelter, food and spiritual nourishment. He was a great believer in Divine Providence especially when his work was imperilled. To further this apostolate he founded the Salesian Fathers and Sisters as well as the Co-operators among Christ's faithful. He died in 1888 and is the patron saint of young people, especially those in poverty.
