

THE STORY OF LOURDES

The story of Lourdes is well known. Between 11th February and 16th July, 1858, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared eighteen times to fourteen-year-old Bernadette Soubirous in that small town located in the foothills of the Pyrenees mountains of southern France.

Bernadette could neither read nor write and spoke only the Occitan dialect of her area. Her family was sinking into poverty, and the day the first apparition took place she went to gather firewood along the bank of the River Gave.

Her attention was drawn to the noise of rustling bushes near the Grotto of Massabielle, from the French vieille masse meaning ancient mass. Then Bernadette saw a beautiful young woman. She described this woman as "dressed in a white robe, girded at the waist with a blue ribbon. She wore



upon her head a white veil which gave just a glimpse of hair. Her feet were bare but covered by the last folds of her robe and a yellow rose was upon each of them. She held on her right arm a rosary of white beads with a chain of gold shining like the two roses."

Bernadette knelt and began to pray the rosary. At the end of the rosary the woman smiled and disappeared. The young visionary returned and on 18th February Our Lady began her message telling young Bernadette, "I do not promise to make you happy in this life but in the next." On 24th February, Mary asked for penance and prayer for the conversion of sinners and the following day, she instructed Bernadette to dig the ground near the grotto. From that a spring came forth which to this day is used for the baths by pilgrims to Lourdes.

At the apparition of 2nd March, Bernadette was instructed by Our Lady to "tell the priests that people should come here in procession and that a chapel should be built on the site." On the Feast of the Annunciation, 25th March, the Blessed Virgin told Bernadette in the dialect of Lourdes, "I am the Immaculate Conception." This dogma had been defined by Pope Pius IX just a few years earlier on 8th December 1854.

The Basilica at Lourdes was consecrated in 1876 and the faithful, countless in number, have flocked in pious pilgrimage to the holy grotto over the years. It is there that they recommit themselves to conform their lives to the Christian message. There, as well, miraculous favours are granted and healings, both physical and spiritual, have taken place. Great emphasis is placed on the Eucharist and just as at the wedding feast of Cana, Mary points to her Son.

On 25th March 1958, an enormous underground basilica which can hold 25,000 pilgrims at any one Mass or Liturgical celebration was opened. There are three basilicas within the domain, with countless chapels, churches and outdoor altars for the 4-6 million pilgrims who visit each year.

Bernadette entered the Sisters of Notre Dame at Nevers in 1866 and was given the name of Sister Mary Bernarda. She worked there as sacristan and avoided publicity as best she could. She referred to herself as "a broom which Our Lady used, but now I have been put back in my corner." She died on 16th April 1879 at the young age of thirty-five, was beatified in 1925 by Pope Pius XI and canonised by him on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, 8th December 1933.

FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

10th February - Memoria of St Scholastica - St Scholastica was born in 480, the twin sister of St Benedict. She set up a community of religious women near his monastery at Monte Cassino. She is honoured as the female members of the Benedictine Order. She died in 543 and is the patron saint of education.

11th February - Memoria of Our Lady of Lourdes - The Memoria of Our Lady of Lourdes commemorates the eighteen apparitions of Our Lady to St Bernadette Soubirous in 1858 in her home village in the south of France. Our Lady called for pilgrims to come and pray and do penance. Pope John Paul II made this a Day of Prayer throughout the whole Church for all who are sick, connecting with the prominent place given to sick people in Lourdes.

14th February - Feast of St Cyril & St Methodius - St Cyril was born in 826 and St Methodius was born in 815, brothers who were born in Thessalonica, Greece, who went on to spread the Faith in Moravia. They translated liturgical texts into Slavonic, using the Cyrillic alphabet which they devised. Cyril died, aged 43, on a visit to Rome. Methodius became a bishop and worked in Pannonia and the present-day Czech Republic, where he is buried at the great shrine of Velehrad. Saints Cyril and Methodius were named as Patrons of Europe by St John Paul II in 1980.
