

## CHRISTMAS MESSAGE FROM BISHOP TOAL

In present circumstances it does feel difficult to look forward to Christmas as we are made aware of further restrictions due to the new variant of the coronavirus. Perhaps the ongoing crisis we are living through makes the happy, indeed joyful, celebration of Christmas all the more necessary as we celebrate the presence of God in our midst in the person of the Baby Jesus.

The birth of a child is a moment of great joy and of thanksgiving for the gift of life and the promise of how that life will grow and fulfil its potential through that person's time on earth. Just as the circumstances of Jesus' birth were challenging that can often be the case for others, but it is amazing how even the weakest, the most disadvantaged, do survive and find their place in the human family. Sadly not everybody does and the tragedies surrounding the loss of little children, and unborn babies, are among the hardest that parents and families face. As we acclaim the Child in the Manger as God, born as one of us, we commend to him those who have lost babies and all who are heart-broken over the loss of loved ones of all ages in recent times.

At Christmas we are invited to come to the manger ourselves in the spirit of the shepherds and wise men to do the Lord homage and present ourselves to him, seeking his grace and peace in our own lives. It is what we do constantly as we turn to God in prayer and come together to participate in the celebration of Holy Mass. Coming to the Christmas Crib is an extra beautiful expression of our faith in the Lord made flesh, who has truly dwelt among us. It is an added opportunity to express our desire to remain close to him always and to receive the fullest benefit of his presence within and among us. The words of the last two verses of *Away in a Manger* come to mind:

Be near me Lord Jesus.  
I ask you to stay  
close by me forever  
and love me I pray.  
Bless all the dear children  
in thy tender care  
and fit us for heaven  
to live with thee there.

I wish you and your families a very Happy and Joyful Christmas and every blessing in 2022.

## FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

**24th December** - In the evening we begin the Season of Christmas. This season is preceded only in importance by the celebration of the Paschal Mystery (the passion, death and resurrection of the Lord), the Church has no more ancient tradition that the celebration of the Christmas Season: from Jesus' humble birth in Bethlehem; the announcement of his birth to the shepherds by the angels; the revelation to the three kings and their subsequent adoration of the child; his Baptism in the River Jordan and the Father's declaration of Jesus as the 'Beloved Son' and the beginning of his public ministry. The other feasts of Christmastide (St Stephen, St John the Evangelist, the Holy Innocents, the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God) all have an intimate connection to the Lord manifesting himself to the human race.

**26th December - Feast of the Holy Family** - If we aspire to a deeper understanding of Jesus' life and mission, we must draw close to the mystery of the Holy Family of Nazareth to observe and listen. This feast offers us the opportunity to admire, put into practice the divine plan to make the family an intimate community of life and love; we learn that each Christian family is called to be a small 'domestic church' that must shine with the Gospel virtues.

**27th December - Feast of St John** - St John was the son of Zebedee and worked as a Galilean fisherman with his brother St James. He was called while mending his nets to follow Jesus and became 'the disciples whom Jesus loved'. Alone among the twelve, he stood at the foot of the cross and was entrusted to the Blessed Virgin Mary. He wrote the fourth Gospel, three Epistles and the Apocalypse, producing profound passages on such themes as the divinity of Christ and the centrality of love. Though tradition records his attempted martyrdom 'at the Latin gate' in Rome, St John lived to a great age, spent many years in exile on Patmos and died in Ephesus. He is the patron saint of love, loyalty, friendships, and authors.

## FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK CONTINUED

**28th December - Feast of the Holy Innocents** - Theology and piety cannot mask the horror behind this feast: the senseless slaughter of innocent infants and the visceral cries of grief-stricken parents, all to satisfy one man's violent, unconscionable insecurity. The Holy Innocents were the young children of the neighbourhood of Bethlehem, all under the age of two, put to death by Herod in an attempt to kill the infant Jesus. These innocent, nameless victims are honoured as the first to shed their blood for Christ.

**1st January - Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God** - This is Our Lady's greatest title. As the mother of the second person of the Holy Trinity, Jesus Christ, she is the mother of God. She walks with us and guides us with motherly tenderness towards her Son and towards the future. She helps humanity by sustaining their hope in the One who is the Lord of history.
