## THE VISIT TO SCOTLAND OF THE RELICS OF ST BERNADETTE

The relics of Lourdes visionary Saint Bernadette will tour England, Wales and Scotland later this year, beginning on 3rd September and concluding on 1st November. The relics' journey around Britain will see the remains of St Bernadette make special visits to our own Carfin Grotto, HMP Wormwood Scrubs – and Liverpool's Anglican Cathedral as well as the Catholic Cathedral.

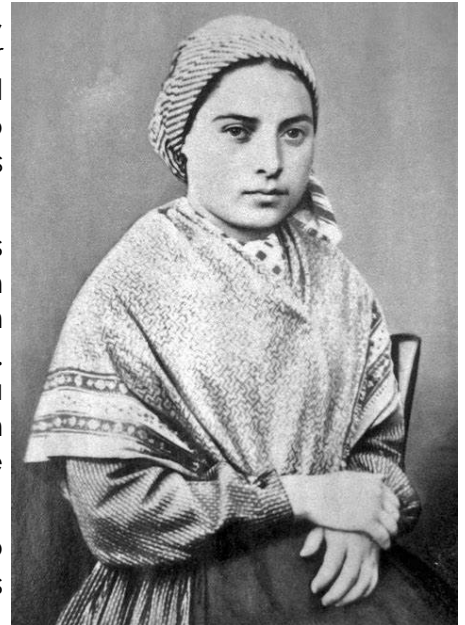
Other notable Catholic churches scheduled to host the relics as they travel to each of England's 22 dioceses include Ampleforth Abbey, Yorkshire, Our Lady of the Assumption and the English Martyrs in Cambridge, and St Winefride's Well Shrine in Holywell. The relics tour, first announced in November 2021, also includes a stop specifically for the Roman Catholic Bishopric of the Forces in Clifton Cathedral on 7th September. When first announced, the visit was compared to the tour of the relics of St Thérèse of Lisieux.

In a letter released through the tour's official website, Archbishop of Westminster Cardinal Vincent Nichols said that the visit "offers us a welcome opportunity to bear active witness to our faith, joining with one another across our many communities to encounter God's love and find spiritual, emotional, and psychological healing and renewal". He asked Catholics to participate in the tour and to continue that participation by considering pilgrimage to Lourdes itself in future. Concluding his letter, the Cardinal thanked God "for the faith of St Bernadette and for the many gifts and graces the relic tour will bring".

Bernadette Soubirous, the child of a miller from Lourdes, southern France, experienced visions of Mary, Mother of Christ, between 11th February and 16th July 1858. After a canonical investigation, Church authorities declared the visions "worthy of belief" in 1862, and Lourdes rapidly became a major site of pilgrimage. Around 70 miracles attributed to the intercession of Our Lady of Lourdes have been validated by the Church to date. Bernadette was canonised in 1933 and her remains were preserved in a shrine in the town of Nevers, central France, the location of the convent Bernadette joined in 1866 and died in in 1879. They are now ordinarily held in the Upper Basilica of Lourdes, which before the coronavirus pandemic attracted around 4 million pilgrims each year.

Carfin Grotto will host the relics of St Bernadette from Saturday 24th September until Sunday 2nd October, the only Scottish venue to receive the relics. This will coincide with the centenary of the Grotto on 2nd October. At a major Mass to be celebrated by the Bishops of Scotland and the Papal Nuncio to Great Britain (the Pope's representative) the Grotto will be raised to the status of Scotland's National Shrine.

Full details of the programme while the relics are at Carfin have still to be announced. When they are made public we will endeavour to run a bus to visit the relics and also to attend the Mass on the Sunday with the Bishops and the Papal Nuncio. St Bernadette is the patron saint of the sick and the poor and through her courage and determination told the story of Our Lady's apparitions to her, despite great personal suffering and hardship.

## FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

**8th August - Memoria of St Dominic** - St Dominic was born around 1170 in Calaruega in Old Castile, Domingo Guzman (his real name) studied at Palencia and, having a reputation for piety and learning, was made a canon of the church at Osma in 1193. His bishop took him on a political mission to the south of France; there he travelled from place to place, working tirelessly and especially preaching conversion to the people. He continued this work for ten years and, gradually gathering companions around him, the first house of The Order of Preachers (Dominicans) was established. In 1215, Dominic took part in the Fourth Lateran Council and, in the following year, the Order received papal approval. Subsequently, the Order adopted additional rules of prayer and poverty. The Order spread very successfully in Europe; there were sixty houses when the founder died in 1221. St Dominic is the patron of astronomers.

**9th August - Feast of St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross** - St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross was born in 1891 of Jewish parents in Breslau, Germany, (now Wroclaw, Poland), Edith Stein was a brilliant student who gained her doctorate in philosophy aged 25. She converted to Catholicism aged 31 and became a Carmelite nun in 1934. Being Jewish, she fled to the Netherlands when the Nazis came to power in Germany but, following the German invasion of the Low Countries in 1940, she was seized by the Nazis and sent to Auschwitz concentration camp. She died there in the gas chamber on 9th August 1942. She is one of the patrons of Europe.

**10th August - Feast of St Lawrence** - St Lawrence, a much venerated and popular saint in Rome, was a deacon who assisted Pope Sixtus II. He is said to have been born in Huesca in Spain around 226 and was martyred in Rome during the persecution of 258. Devotion to the saint has produced several stories, especially of his important work in Rome and of his behaviour at his execution. The tradition is that he was roasted to death on a gridiron and that, on it, he asked to be turned over 'to do the other side'. He is venerated as the patron of deacons, chefs, comedians and firefighters.

**11th August - Memoria of St Clare** - St Clare was born in 1293, the daughter of wealthy parents in Assisi, and was attracted by the life and teaching of St Francis. She spent some time with him and his group, but then, in 1212, she founded her own women's Franciscan group, usually known as the Poor Clares. They were to live lives of poverty, austerity and prayer. As their leader, Clare lived at the little church of San Damiano, just outside Assisi. Her remains are venerated in the church of Santa Chiara in the town. Nowadays there are many different congregations of women worldwide, all following the Franciscan way of life. She is the patron of phones & TV.

## CHORAL VESPERS FOR THE SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION

To celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption next Sunday, there will be Choral Vespers in St Mary's beginning at 6.30pm concluding with Solemn Benediction. The Schola Benedicti, who will lead this Liturgy, is a chamber choir which operates in Scotland and England. They have as their aim to revive the Church's great musical tradition, especially in the young. Fr Wyllie invites and encourages all parishioners to support this event.
