#### FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK

**1st August - Memoria of St Alphonsus Ligouri** - St Alphonsus Mary de Ligouri was born in 1696 near Naples and talented in the arts of music, painting and poetry, his first choice of career was law but, aged 27, he decided to be a priest. He worked among homeless youth in Naples and in nearby rural areas, became known as a preacher with a simple and direct style and as a confessor who, although opposing moral laxity, rejected rigorist attitudes, such as Jansenism. In 1732 he founded the Redemptorist Order and in 1762 he was made bishop of Sant' Agata de' Goti. He had a special devotion to Mary, particularly under the title of "Our Lady of Perpetual Help". Due to ill-health and difficulties for his active work, he resigned from the diocese in 1775 and returned to private life in his order. He died in 1787. He is honoured as the patron of confessors, moral theologians, and the lay apostolate.

**4th August - Memoria of St John Mary Vianney** - St John Mary Vianney was born in 1786 and had to contend with poverty, military service and his own intellectual shortcomings in order to become a priest. In 1817, he was sent to care for the people of Ars, a small, obscure French village. The marvellous gift of the unlearned priest for seeing into the depths of the soul brought the world to Ars. From 1830 on, the Curè averaged twelve to sixteen hours a day in the confessional hearing confessions. He died in 1858 and is the patron of parish priests.

**5th August - Memoria of the Dedication of the Basilica of St Mary Major** - The Ecumenical Council of Ephesus in 431 declared Mary to be 'Mother of God' (Theotokos). Soon afterwards, Pope Sixtus III had the Basilica of St Mary Major built on the Esquiline Hill in Rome. It is the earliest church built in her honour in the West. It is said that its location was determined by a snowfall on 5th August, a rather rare event during the excruciatingly warm Roman summers, and which enabled a plan of the church to be drawn in situ.

6th August - Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord - Accounts of this event are to be found in each of the three synoptic gospels (Matthew, Mark & Luke). The feast is, above all, the Father's reassurance that, despite the forthcoming crucifixion of his Son, we must not lose faith in him as our Saviour. He is the Messiah in whom the Father is 'well pleased'.

### GOSPEL FOR TODAY

Today, the 18th Sunday of Ordinary Time, the Word of God spurs us to reflect on what our relationship with material things should be.

Although wealth is a good in itself, it should not be considered an absolute good. Above all, it does not guarantee salvation; on the contrary, it may even seriously jeopardise it.

In today's Gospel, Jesus puts his disciples on guard precisely against this risk. It is wisdom and virtue not to set one's heart on the goods of this world for all things are transient, all things can suddenly end.

For us Christians, the real treasure that we must ceaselessly seek consists in the "things above... where Christ is seated at God's right hand"; St Paul reminds us of this today in his Letter to the Colossians, adding that our life "is hid with Christ in God" (see 3: 1-3).

May the Virgin, who was more closely involved in Christ's mystery than any other creature, sustain us on our pilgrimage of faith so that, as the liturgy invites us to pray today, "we do not let ourselves be dominated by greed or selfishness as we toil with our efforts to subdue the earth but seek always what is worthwhile in God's eyes".

#### GETTING BACK TO OUR NORMAL WEEKLY SCHEDULE

As the summer holidays are drawing to a close, our normal weekly parish schedule will resume in mid-August. As we have a few weeks before this happens, Fr Wyllie would like to extend an invitation and an encouragement to all parishioners to support all that happens each week in our parish. Here are a few things he would like to encourage you to come along to:

**The Wednesday Evening Mass** - This was introduced to enable those who work during the day to attend Mass at least once a week. Although this Mass is quite well attended, there are very few parishioners attending who couldn't attend the morning Mass. So please, if you work during the day, try to make an effort to come along to Mass on a Wednesday evening.

**The Monday 12noon Mass** - Although this Mass was introduced because Fr Wyllie spent Monday mornings in the High School, it is a good opportunity for people who aren't great in the mornings to manage along to Mass during the week. Please try to come along to the 12noon Mass on a Monday.

**Morning Mass** - Great emphasis has been placed on receiving Holy Communion as often as possible, but sadly, we have a dwindling number of parishioners attending weekday Mass, especially in Our Lady & St John's (some mornings we only have 5 or 6). If you are retired, parttime, on holiday or unemployed please try to come along to Mass in the mornings to sanctify your day and to come before the altar to hear God's word and receive him sacramentally.

**Confessions** - We do well here in the parish with people coming for Confession. There are various opportunities each week for Confession so please avail yourself of this Sacrament of God's love and mercy. Each week confessions are heard in St Mary's on a Saturday evening from 4.45pm until 5.15pm and a Wednesday morning from 9.30am until 9.50am; Our Lady & St John's on a Wednesday evening from 6.30pm until 6.50pm and a Thursday morning from 9.00am until 9.30am.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament - Spending time with the Lord exposed on the altar is a moment of grace for us as individuals and as a parish. Please make a special effort to come along for the periods of adoration which take place each week in both churches.
